FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Where God is Leading

Your church leadership gathered Thursday, May 23rd for their May Session meeting. By general consent the Session approved:

- Stated Session meeting held April 25
- Service of Ordination for Ardy Skidmore on June 1
- Celebration of Sacrament of Communion at our combined worship service with Iglesia Bautista Emanuel on Sunday, June 16
- Approval of Emmaus to celebrate Sacrament of Communion while using space at Central on August 3

Reports were received from Expanding Cultural Diversity, Ministry to Young Families and from the Pastoral Nominating Committee as each continues to plan and move forward.

The Pastoral Nominating Committee reported that they are in the process of interviewing candidates.

The Session approved request from Tom Schmutzler and the Fetner family to establish The Sheila Ann Marlowe Fetner Scholarship Fund enabling children with limited financial resources to participate in the Central Fine Arts Academy which will begin this Fall.

Committee Motions:

Publicity Committee presented recommendations for upgrades for Wi-Fi/internet and improvement to the current phone system. Since March the Committee has conducted six site visits and received proposals. The adopted motion of the Publicity Committee was to set aside \$15,000. to fund a new phone system and wi-fi campus wide. The motion came to the Session with the support and approval of the

Finance Committee with funding of the request to come from the Capital Reserve Fund. An article to follow in the newsletter will further define the need for the upgraded system.

Christian Education Committee reported on plans for Central Jamboree to be held on Saturday, July 2 and summer program series, "What Presbyterians Believe", beginning July 21.

Worship Committee reported on return to summer worship schedule June 23.

Committee Shared Information:

Attention will be given to the Facilities Use Task Force which will report at the June meeting regarding their recommendations on rental use and contracts.

Personnel Committee reported on the hiring of Mr. Anthony Tucker as church custodian. Mr. Tucker will be introduced by means of newsletter and also on a specified Sunday morning.

Mission Committee reported on a 2019 commitment to Charlotte Presbytery of \$5700.

Concern and prayers were expressed for Craig Martin, Leigh Ann Burns, Jerry Cheek, Tom Schmutzler, Emily Cheek, Bill Gordon, Brad Clapham, Diane Price and Donna Young, George Bostick and Russell Helms.

Chet and Chris Knapp briefly reported on their most recent representation as Commissioners at Presbytery.

The Session expressed appreciation to Sheila Fetner for her 25 years of service to Central, to Tom Schmutzler for his support, and to those who planned and prepared the reception following her service.

The meeting concluded with prayer and the celebration of the Lord's Supper.

FINANCE TEAM UPDATE

Income (for budgeted items) needed as of 4/30/19: \$150,780 Income (for budgeted items) received as of 4/30/19: \$134.903

The income needed figure above comes directly from the 2019 annual budget as approved by Session and represents the amount we would need to fully fund all church ministries. We are committed to not spending in excess of our income so we throttle back on spending accordingly and, as is normal, show a deficit when comparing income received to income needed.

As we closed out the month of April it's "steady as she goes." Regular giving (gifts not designated for Capital Reserve or other specific purposes) was up 8% over what was expected based on 2019 pledges. And regular giving thru April is up about \$9,000 compared with the same period in 2018. With God's continued blessings and your faithful giving, Central continues to move forward.
