O sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord all the earth, (Psalm 96:1). O sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things, (Psalm 98:1).

God has done something for us that we cannot do. Isn't that right? Therefore, we respond to that. The Psalmist said it backwards. "Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things." Both Psalm 96 and 98 imply that we should make a response to God for what God has done for us, that we should do (sing in their case) something new. How can we not? God's grace always comes as a surprise to us, as something new. Therefore, we do or sing or try or make or start... something new. Get it?

It sounds a little like a New Year's resolution. In the interest of full disclosure, I have never been very fond of either the New Year Holiday or the resolutions that supposedly come with it. They both, in my experience, are mostly a let-down. Of 39 news years that I have witnessed, I can only think of one resolution that I kept. Whether it was praying, losing weight, exercising... it stuck for about two or three weeks, but then was promptly forgotten.

The only resolution that stuck, oddly enough, was one I had forgotten that I made. Lena Young, in fact, had to remind me of it. Evidently I had resolved one year to play my guitar more. I started playing the guitar probably fifteen years ago, but never got really good at it... until I made that resolution. Not that I'm all that great now, but I'm a whole lot better than I was, *all because I made a resolution and stuck with it.* And, for the record, I have stuck with it ever since.

But why the difference? How was my resolution for the guitar different from losing weight or exercising? The only thing I can think of is that I actually *enjoyed* playing the guitar. Evidently, I made the resolution (which is normal), stuck with it for two weeks (also normal), but then actually enjoyed it (which is not normal. Who enjoys losing weight?) so much so that I had forgotten that I made the resolution in the first place, until, of course, Lena reminded me of it.

The Christian life certainly has a place for discipline. It's good that we wake up early in the morning and exercise, for example, or that we find a time to read Scripture and pray. It's good that we are *disciplined* about such things, because if we are not, they certainly don't happen on their own.

But I'm not so sure that God has ever desired to be a resolution that we keep, like an item on a list that we can check off. I am sure, though, that God wants to be *in relationship* with us, which is about a great deal more than resolutions. Maybe it's mostly about enjoyment. "What is the chief end of man? Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever," says the 1st question of both the shorter and longer Westminster Catechism. Imagine that! Those frozen-chosen, stuff Presbyterians actually enjoying something. But maybe that's the whole point.

When do you most fully enjoy God? When do you most fully enjoy life? Maybe it's when you're outside working in your garden, or hiking some trails, or running. Maybe it's spending time with family. Maybe it involves music. Whatever it is... go do that this year. Do that a lot. I'm not saying to ditch church for the duck blind. I'll write on that later. But for now. God has given you a splendid little life. Go, for God's sake, and enjoy that life. Make a resolution to live fully in it. Next thing you know, you will have enjoyed God and one another and appreciated the new and marvelous things that God has done. And... you will have kept a resolution that you forgot you even made.
