From the Pastor's Pen

Remember the Sabbath day, and keep it holy,
(Exodus 20:8).

If I ever admonish you to keep the Sabbath, you know that thunder is about to strike. Pastors are notoriously bad at Sabbath-keeping. By definition, we work on Sabbaths. Like most of the rest of the world, we get Saturdays off, but often spend much of that thinking about Sundays. We're supposed to take another day in the week (it was Friday for me) to compensate, but I always spent Fridays working at home on sermons anyway. Since I started this doctorate, I study at home on Thursdays and come in the office on Fridays. In short, there's always a but... We *should* keep the Sabbath, *but*...

Regardless of schedules, conflicts, deadlines, etc..., I *should* be more diligent about the Sabbath. The sixth commandment, after all, is a gift that is only good if we use it. In fairness to pastors, though, we are the only people that I know of who are *never not* on call. The hours spent officially working are flexible, which I appreciate, but if someone needs me on a holiday, or a weekend, or at night, or even on vacation, I need to show up. Today's pastors are also slugging through a context of change and decline. The church is certainly not the grand old respected institution that it once was. As such, people are anxious, and they often project that anxiety into their churches, which lands squarely between their pastor's eyes.

I love my job, I am blessed do be doing this, and we have a great congregation here. That's not true for many pastors. I just met with a few pastors and their horror stories are chilling. I am very blessed, then, in every way to serve here. Having mentioned all of that, though, I'm tired and I need a break. My contract has a stipulation for a three-month sabbatical every seven years. My seventh year was last year, but I didn't think I needed a

sabbatical then or even wanted one. This year, I know better. So I'm taking one. My last Sunday here will be June 12th and I will return on August 14th. British Hyrams, our DCM, will ably hold down the fort while I'm gone. She will assume preaching and pastoral care duties, and several of our students will preach, as well. If there is an emergency, my cell number is still good and works beautifully. If I am needed, especially for a funeral, I will do my best to be here.

Some people go on these elaborate trips for their sabbaticals. One friend of mine studied in Scotland and another friend took his camper across the country. I've got a few trips planned, but most of my days will be spent in the library at Union Seminary studying for this doctorate. Needless to say, I have a lot to read and a lot to write, so much so that I will need to get back to work in August to get a break.

To be honest, I've got mixed feelings about sabbaticals. Raymond Young pastored this church and Pleasant Hill jointly for close to thirty years and never once went on sabbatical. Then again, that was a very different time and place. I think my main objection to it, though, is that it just doesn't feel productive enough. Even if I do read all fifteen of these books and write all sixty of these pages (which is quite a feat for me), something about a sabbatical offends my sense of industry and hard work. When, after all, was your last sabbatical?

Yet we all desperately need rest, and I do think that pastors almost always teeter on the brink of collapse. Now that I think about it, maybe that's why the vast majority of my seminary classmates are no longer pastoring congregations. We all need rest. Pastors need rest. I need rest. I haven't gotten much lately, but that's about to change. I will tell you all about it in August! I love you all and am blessed to be your pastor.

THE BEGINNING OF THE CONVERSATION



“But it is not the whole of the good news. There is also life. Christianity is not just faith about the past and hope for the future: it is also love in the present. Christianity is a way of living made possible by the removal of our panic about death. It is a way characterized by joy, peace, gentleness, goodness, and patience. Today we would add words that we associate with the virtues of our era - words like generosity, hospitality, kindness, inclusivity, respect, compassion, trust, and dignity. Jesus says I *am* the life - not “I bring the life” or “I procure the life” or “I promise the life” - but I *am* the life.¹ This is a present tense thing. If you cannot live it now, what hope does it truly give for the future?”

The problem for the church is how easy it is for Christians to get a hold of one of these dimensions and not the other. Half the church grabs hold of the resurrection and runs the danger of missing the life. It concentrates on personal salvation, getting into heaven, knowing you are forgiven, having a personal relationship with Jesus, and often a rather narrow range of issues in so-called personal morality that promise to keep us in God's good books. The risk is that Christianity becomes a means to an end, a device to avoid hell and head toward heaven forever; in short a rather self-centered and limited project. People tend to look at it from the outside and wonder whether it really and truly represents the life that Jesus is talking about.

Yet half the church makes the opposite mistake. It concentrates on the life, and talks about justice, and tolerance, and rights, and affirmation, and the planet, and never quite gets round to focusing on the crisis of death, the need for personal repentance, the awesomeness of judgment, the fear of oblivion or everlasting torment or isolation in eternity. The trouble with this is that, while it is admirable, it is not always clear in what sense it is Christianity, because the commitments and perceptions are often shared with a whole range of secular and religious people looking for a better and more equal society; and often reference to Jesus disappears almost altogether.”
