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From the Pastor's Pen

It was on March 11, 2020 that the World Health Organization (WHO) declared COVID-19 a World Pandemic. Central gathered in-person on March 15 to worship, but the Session decided to cancel in-person worship and shift to Virtual Worship, in compliance with the order of the North Carolina Governor. Our members stepped up and helped with the Virtual Worship and we made the best of the challenging situations for the next 5 months as we worshiped together through the use of the internet. We resumed in-person worship in September of 2020 under the leadership and direction of the Re-Opening Task Force and the Session. Central is truly grateful to have servants with wonderful technical gifts and talents who took the lead in creating the capacity to livestream our Sunday morning worship service. We went from 0 to 100 mph... digitally speaking... in a short heart, O God, you will not despise." I period of time so that our members with compromising and underlying health conditions can join Sunday worship service from home. We owe our thanks to the members of the Publicity Team for their talents, efforts and sacrifice in making this possible for Central. We are approaching one full year since the beginning of this COVID-19 pandemic and this is the worst kind of anniversary we can experience in our lives. About 500,000 people have lost their lives in America because of this terrible virus and millions more have been compromised in their health because they contracted this virus, including some of our members. Tens of millions of people have lost their jobs and hundreds of thousands of small businesses were forced to close their doors. Kids were relegated to using Zoom and video classes in order to attend school during their most important and formative years. This has been a very difficult and challenging year for all of us.

We are beginning to see Central members coming back to in-person after receiving

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their vaccinations. There's great joy in seeing familiar faces, with masks on, coming back to church after being away for many months. I hope to see many more faces returning back to church in the coming weeks and months. Let me also take a moment here to acknowledge all the members who came in-person week after week to serve and to encourage one another during this pandemic. Your selfless service is very much appreciated and your support will not be forgotten by a grateful church. In this Season of Lent, my hope is that all of you will experience the renewing work and movement of the Holy Spirit in your daily life. Approach the throne of God's grace with hearts of repentance and seek to draw closer to our God with humble and contrite hearts. Psalm 51:17... "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite pray that Acts 3:19~20 will be a daily inspiration for you during this Lenten Season... "Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out, that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, and that he may send the Christ appointed for you.


The CSCPC Scholarship is awarded each year for that school year only.



Update: Y School Plus @ Central

The YMCA is continuing to support students and their families with the School Plus program for remote learning. Recently, the Y program had to adapt as Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools started transitioning the students back to in-person classes in late February. Elementary students attend classes at their school 2 days a week, continuing with 3 days remote. Middle school students will attend in-person classes one week, with 2 weeks remote.

We have the opportunity to show our active faith. This has been a challenging year for the students. There are concerns about learning gaps, even with a support program such as the Y School Plus. Central members can help to support these students.

- Schoolwork Assistant: Work with staff to help children with remote learning and homework in a way that extends children's understanding and interest. Helping children feel successful by giving positive feedback and support. There are 2 time slots each day: 10:30 - noon or 1 pm – 2pm, from now until the end of June. This will be most effective if you could commit one day a week (or more) for a few weeks at a time. Even if you wish to wait until after your Covid-19 vaccine shots, you can register as a volunteer for that later time. - Be a Friend (Remotely): You can be a friend by sharing notes, pictures to draw, reading materials, etc. to one of the elementary students. Ann Mozingo shared the pleasure that she has in gaining a young friend. Ann will help others get started, sharing her expertise as an elementary teacher.
