FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

On July 17, 2020, John Robert Lewis passed away at the age of 80. He was a congressman from the state of Georgia, but he was so much more than just a congressman. John Lewis was a Civil Rights Leader for most of his life and one of the leaders of the 1963 March on Washington. In 1965, Lewis led the march across the Edmund Pettus Bridge in an incident which became known as "Bloody Sunday". Images from that "Bloody Sunday" shocked the nation and galvanized support for the Voting Rights Act of 1965, signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson. His casket crossed that bridge one last time and the Alabama State Troopers were there to salute him... a stark contrast from the beating his body took back in 1965. His life was celebrated from Selma to Washington DC as his casket was laid in the Capitol Rotunda. John Lewis is the first Black lawmaker to lie in state at the US Capitol Rotunda. Lying in state is a tribute reserved for the most distinguished government officials and military officers. John Lewis began a transformation that continues to this day and we must all take up his work of bringing equality and justice in our society and in the presence of our God. Galatians 6:9 says, "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up."

Central will be continuing our Virtual Worship Service through the month of August and our hope is that we will return to In-Person worship service in September. Central is a partner to Steele Creek Elementary School. We support the students and teachers throughout the school year. This is how you can help now:

School Supplies Needed even with Covid-19

School supplies are still needed – even with students involved in remote learning assignments as well as when schools re-open for in-school classes. They will need: wide ruled notebook paper, colored paper, glue, crayons, markers, pencils, small pencil sharpeners, erasers, pens, file cards, spiral bound and 3 – ring notebooks, scissors, etc.

We will start collecting the items now to take advantage of the Back-to-School Sales. Please note: Some stores allow you to order on-line and have curbside or store pick-up. These include Office Depot, Walmart (some items) and Target.

Your donations can be left at the church office or brought to Narthex when worship services begin again. We will store the items at the church and deliver them as the teachers need the supplies.

Teacher Appreciation Treats

Would you be willing to donate snacks or treats for the teachers at Steele Creek Elementary as they prepare to start the school year?

For the last few years, we have provided baked goods to provide support and encouragement to teachers each month. The homemade treats were much appreciated. The word would spread quickly throughout the school when they were delivered.

However, our teacher appreciation treats will need to be different due to the Covid-19. It is requested that we provide store bought and individually packaged items. Examples are snack size (lunch box) packages of cookies (like Oreos), individual bags of chips, Lance crackers, etc. We need to skip cookies from the store bakery, etc. since they are not individually packaged at the manufacturer.

If you can help, please drop off the items at the church office between now and August 5^{th} , prior to the start of Teacher Workdays.

Support of Student Families with Food Insecurity

Central members and friends helped to provide groceries for 21 student families from four of the Steele Creek area schools during the spring and summer.

Soon after the public schools closed, the school staffs identified student families that were hit very hard by

Covid-19 and struggling. Many of the families were already vulnerable due to lack of affordable housing, homelessness, chronic health problems, etc. When jobs were lost, they needed extra help. We have been able to provide emergency help in terms of groceries or grocery gift cards to be used for perishable items such as milk and eggs.

The need may continue or even increase this fall. The Mission Committee will reach out again with specific ways in which you can help.

Both the families and school principals have been appreciative of our support. Below is a thank you from the principal of Winget Park.
