FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

October, 2020

Several people have recommended a documentary on Netflix called "The Social Dilemma," including a couple of church members. Before committing 1.5 hours in watching this documentary, I wanted to do some research and here is a description that I came across... "The Social Dilemma attempts to expose the ways in which technology giants have manipulated human psychology to influence how we behave. And if you think that sounds absolutely terrifying, you'd be right." Here was another promotion for the documentary... "Never before have a handful of tech designers had such control over the way billions of us think, act, and live our lives." OK, I was sold, so I committed to watching the documentary. People will have different opinions about the documentary, but I came away with new information about the pitfalls and dangers of social media platforms when not used properly for the benefit of our society. All of the experts and executives of the social media giants in this documentary agree that these platforms were created with good intentions in mind for our society. But good intentions began to erode and dissipate in the face of culture of unchecked capitalism, which seeks to manipulate human behavior for profit. What was intended for good became a tool for division, hate and misinformation.

I don't know about you, but I see a great degree of parallelism between the evolution of social media and God's creation in Genesis. Just like the original intention of the

creation of social media, which was for good, God created everything in this world and at the end of each day concluded... "And God saw that it was good." Everything was good until Adam & Eve became selfish and hungry for power and authority equal to God... with nudging from a serpent. The serpent psychologically manipulated Adam & Eve so that they would lose focus of their true reason for existence and accepted & followed misinformation disguised as the truth. The documentary states that false information circulates and reaches people six times more on social media than the truth. Therefore, truth is no longer absolute, but it's relative to individual reality of the person's acceptance of what is true for them. While the society struggles with the truth, believers need to share the truth about salvation by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. During these difficult and challenging times, people are losing hope and that includes self-professed Christians.
