On Sunday, April 4, we will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. In John Masefield's drama, 'The Trial of Jesus,' the Roman centurion who commanded the joined together, grows into a holy troops that crucified Jesus reports to Pilate after he performs the task. Pilate's wife begs the centurion to tell her the story.

She asks, "Do you think he is dead?" "No."

"Then where is he?" The centurion replies, "Let loose in the world where neither Roman nor Jew can stop his truth.'

Jesus is "let loose" in this world and His power flows freely to all who accept Him and rely on the power of the Holy Spirit. I pray that all of you will be transformed through your faith in Jesus Christ, who resurrected on this Easter Sunday.

Every day should be a resurrection day for believers of Christ. Meaning, each day should be an Easter day... a day of transformation, which is possible because Jesus Christ is



2020 - 2021 Letter of Explanation

Some examples of support this past year:

- Funded the Y Parent Coffee Ministry on our campus that began in September 2020. Our pastor and volunteers handed out early morning coffee and snacks to Y parents dropping off their children for remote learning. A prayer request form was included in their snack pack. This led to prayer submissions to our pastor from some of the parents needing prayers from our congregation. The coffee and prayer requests gave us opportunities to connect with the Y parents and thank them for their sacrifice during COVID19.
- Provided support for an individual in jeopardy of losing housing and experiencing hardship during the pandemic.
- Provided families with food who were hard hit by loss of jobs last spring & summer due to Covid.
- Donated teacher supplies to at Steele Creek Elementary teachers during the pandemic managing remote learning.
- Provided educational resources to teachers who work with special populations (English learners, special education) and special classes (music, physical education, etc.).
- Provided clothing and Christmas toys to a ten-year-old girl, special needs child. Alerted by a local preschool as the child is overweight and has clothes that do not fit her.
- Supported a family of five with three small children during the Christmas holidays with clothing and some toys.
- Provided support for an older, partially blind woman who was homeless and who
 also needed food for her dogs that provided security as she lived in a tent.
- Provided special Valentines Day gifts and Christian materials with personal notes from the Mighty Acts Class to Y children during remote learning. Some kids are foster children traumatized from being abandoned by their natural parents.
