There is no substitute for face-to-face & in-person learning, especially for elementary students and I hope schools can return back to normalcy in the classrooms for the fall of 2021. Hopefully vaccinations will lead to safer school environment and everyone involved in the new school year will be protected and safe from any COVID related issues.

In speaking of the fall, Central is preparing for a community outreach event called "Central Serve" and it will take place on Saturday, October 23 from 10am to 2pm. Serving Our Neighbors – Food Insecurity

Food Share: The Food Share program through Loaves and Fishes provides families with a box of fresh groceries. As volunteers, we help organize the food boxes, set-up the drive-through location and load the grocery boxes into cars. Families register with Loaves and Fishes prior to the event. They will line-up in the church parking lot, allowing the cars to driver through and receive the food box.

Central hosted three Food Share events this past winter. They were positive events even with the cold and rain. We knew we were directly helping our neighbors.

Mobile Food Pantry at Steele Creek Elementary on Tuesday, August 3rd.

Steele Creek Elementary will sponsor a Mobile Food Pantry through Second Harvest. This will help student families from Kennedy and Olympic as well as Steele Creek.

Location: School parking lot on 4100 Gallant Lane, off Brown Grier Road

Families will drive through to receive a box/bag of groceries. Volunteers are needed to work with the school staff and teachers. Responsibilities: pack grocery bags or boxes; load the groceries into cars; help keep the cars moving. Second Harvest provides mobile pantries to the higher poverty elementary schools in the Charlotte region. To help ensure that children have enough nutritious food to eat and come to school prepared to learn, this program provides on-site food shopping for low-income families. Each pantry provides staple goods, produce, meat, eggs, whole grain breads and essential non-food items like toilet paper and diapers, on average providing 40 to 50 pounds of food per family. The Food Bank will provide over 150 school-based mobiles this year.

She was a student at Brevard College and died in an automobile accident in December 1979. The Central Steele Creek Church Scholarship Fund was started in 1984 as a tribute to her memory. The award is made yearly and only the interest is used to finance the scholarship with the principal remaining untouched. Additional donations are gratefully accepted as the cost of a college education continues to rise.

The Pete and Gertrude Memorial Scholarship was established in 2014. The Gallants were long time members of our church and their daughter Carol Gallant has funded the scholarship in their honor. This scholarship is given to the recipient for four consecutive years provided the student maintains acceptable grades in their field of study.

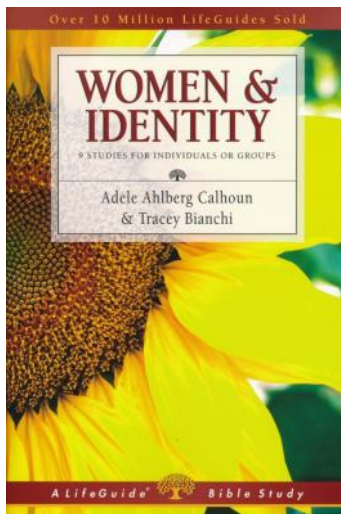
To the congregation:
