Community Outreach/Mission Projects

Food Share:

Central held the 5th Food Share event on October 29th, serving 75 families. The Food Share program is sponsored by Loaves and Fishes and provides families with fresh groceries. As volunteers, we helped to pack the food boxes, direct the cars, and load the grocery boxes into cars. Thank you to the many volunteers!





Helping Students with Food Insecurity and Housing Instability:

There are students in our area schools who face both unstable housing situations and food insecurity. In a small way, we are supporting these students by providing emergency food items. The students are identified by the guidance counselors and social workers at three schools: Steele Creek Elementary, South Pine Academy, and Southwest Middle School.

Week-end Food Bags:

Thank you for helping assemble the week-end food bags after worship service on October 2nd and 29th. With so many people helping, we quickly assembled 100 bags each time. Each of these bags will help a child have extra resources to get through a week-end. The items are chosen to be kid-friendly, both in items that they like and can prepare on his/her own by using just a microwave. The school counselors at Steele Creek Elementary and South Pine Academy make sure that these bags go home in the child's backpack each Friday. Twenty to 25 bags are delivered to the schools each week.

Thanksgiving Support:

For the students at Southwest Middle School, we will provide groceries to 10 families to help with Thanksgiving. These will be nonperishable foods such as a canned ham, vegetables, stuffing, canned fruit and pie filling, and mixes for muffins and pie crusts. Steele Creek Y will join with us by supporting 5 additional families.
