From the Pastor's Pen

It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ. For this I toil and struggle with all the energy that he powerfully inspires within me.

Colossians 1:28-29 (emphasis mine)

As a preacher of the gospel of Jesus Christ, Paul was as relentless at this task as he was in his persecution of Christians prior to his life changing experience in Damascus. Paul proclaimed the good news of Jesus Christ and taught anyone who would listen (maybe even those who didn't want to listen) about faith and life in Christ. This very letter was written to the church in Colossae while Paul was in prison; no need to let that situation deter him! Paul doesn't take all the credit for his tenacity and dedication. He willingly gives credit to God for it – God provides the energy, power, and inspiration.

I am thankful for each person's commitment to serving others.

As we each toil and struggle to be faithful to the endeavors that God has called us to this summer, let's be thankful for the energy, power, and inspiration that God has given us to do it!

THE BEGINNING OF THE CONVERSATION




"Effective second chair leaders in the church understand God's vision for their congregation, and they embrace it wholeheartedly. They are able to see ways to accelerate progress toward the vision. They can design and implement new ministries and overhaul old ones to keep the congregation on track. They can share the vision with others and expand the foundation of committed leaders and followers. They can lift the leadership burden from the first chair without usurping authority.

...The executive or associate pastor is not the only second chair leader in a church. Other second chair leaders in your congregation may have any number of titles or roles. In a multi-staff church, other pastoral and program staff could be second chair leaders. We also know that it does not take a paycheck to be a leader in a congregation. Second chair leaders may be found in the congregation's key decision-making body: deacons, elders, session, church council, vestry. Or they may lead specific ministries and have widespread influence in doing so. Some lay leaders have enormous influence despite their lack of a significant title or formal role. A person's position may be a platform from which to lead, but a title is not what makes someone an effective second chair leader."


