## From the Pastor's Pen

For it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us. (Acts 15:28).

Sometimes we have hard decisions to make. Sometimes they are individual and personal, and other times they are collective and institutional. The text above quotes an outcome of one of the church's most monumental decisions. Should Gentile Christians be expected to follow Old Testament law? It's a foregone conclusion for us, but at the time, it was THE question. Gentiles were converting more quickly than Jews. They were quick to acknowledge the lordship of Jesus Christ, but didn't want to observe Old Testament laws. They were not Jews, after all, so why should they be forced to essentially become Jewish in order to become Christian? And yet, the other side insisted, Jesus himself was a Jew and clearly instructed his followers not to strike one iota from the Torah, or the law.

It was a huge decision with far reaching implications. So the apostles and elders met together in Acts 15. They prayed, worshipped, debated, and finally decided "that we should not trouble these Gentiles who are turning to God." In announcing their decision, they wrote a letter to "The brothers of Gentile origin in Antioch and Syria and Cilicia." The Jewish restrictions would not stand, they stated, "for it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to impose on you no further burden."

But how did they know that it "seemed good to the Holy Spirit"? How

did they even know that "it was good to us" when several of "us" strongly disagreed? I'm not sure they ever did know. They gathered, they framed the question, they listened to one another, they were open and hospitable, they kept silence, and then they decided. They never did know, though. I don't think we ever can fully know. But we can fully have faith that God knows us and will lead us in the proper direction.

This church has a monumental decision to make very soon. Should we merge with other Presbyterian congregations in Steele Creek or not? We have been wrestling with this for three years now. I and the session believe that the time has come for us to make a decision. We cannot be in limbo indefinitely. If we do decide to merge, we almost certainly will have to move. Like the apostles and elders meeting in Acts 15, we have met. Like them, we have framed the question, listened to one another, been open and hospitable, and kept silence.

It's time to move on. As such, we will have a congregational gathering on Sunday, May 7, during the Sunday school hour to discuss and resolve the matter. Like the early church, we will discern together what God is calling us to do. And, like them, we will have faith that whatever the outcome of that discernment, it will "seem good to the Holy Spirit and to us."

# THE BEGINNING OF THE CONVERSATION



"Then my brother pointed to me and said, "Romans 8:28." We spent much of that night asking each other to recite the verses of the Bible we had memorized but never truly heard. At one point I found myself saying the precious lines of Isaiah 43: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you...Because you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you." By the time I finished reciting those words, I was crying.

That night, when a passage about the sustaining love of God cast out fear that was too deep for me to even acknowledge, became the turning point in my life.

I've told this story before and keep telling myself that it's all behind me now. I've been blessed to be in one position of leadership after another. But what I finally learned in hearing that text was that my experience has stayed with me every step of the way.

I don't keep taking chances in offering leadership because I expect to succeed; I take them because I know I can handle it if I fail. What's the worst that can happen? Will I be alone, broke, and abandoned? Been there. Will I make humiliating mistakes? I tried hitchhiking on a closed interstate. And at the bottom, I found the relentless love of God who was with me and always will be, no matter how deep the waters.

When you find God at the bottom, it's possible to enjoy life's highs and lows without fearing you'll fall beneath the love of a Savior. No one can be fully alive, and no one can lead, without getting rid of that fear.



#### AKILAH'S YAV ADVENTURE

Simple Living for a Complex Person

I...am not a simple person. Simple living affects everyone differently and is defined by everyone differently. I'm the type of person who hopes for the best, but prepares for the worst. I have a lot of stuff. Even my stuff has stuff. When I travel, I make sure I have options and emergency everything. I live in a constant state of "just in case" this happens, "just in case" I need that. I say all of this, to say - simple living has been a challenge for me.

My experience as a YAV in the Philippines has made simple living physically, emotionally, and culturally challenging. Physically, I have to deal with transporting all my stuff. Perhaps I've been a bit spoiled by my dad and brothers, but I'm not used to having to carry my stuff. To make it easier on myself and everyone around me, I have to pack simply. I have to travel light. I have to avoid taking over the entire apartment with my stuff. And it's difficult, it's really hard to not have stuff when I'm so used to it. I don't have random movies to watch, or snacks to eat, or games to play. I don't have dozens of combinations of clothes to wear. It's not feasible and it's not reasonable.

Emotionally, I struggle with not having the comforts of home. There's a sense of security when you're at home, around friends and family, going to the places you are familiar with. Personally, it's hard to reconcile the fact that, as much as I like the people I've met, and the places I've been, they aren't "home." But home isn't something I will have in the near future as I head to medical school. Simple living and forging new relationships aren't going anywhere. This YAV year has been great preparation.

The cultural challenges are difficult, too. My example is not a "simple living" challenge, but related to living simply and immersing yourself in a culture different from your own. Just because the Filipino people know English, does not mean you'll be able to blend in, culturally. Now, I didn't come to the Philippines thinking that, but I really do thank God that I didn't have that expectation. Between adjusting to "appropriate" conversations and topics, to understanding general body language and customs, I've been in a constant whirlwind of confusion and discomfort. Just when I think I'm starting to understand something about the culture, some new thing pops up and then I'm confused about something else. And there's always a bit of discomfort when there are topics that aren't talked about or may be considered rude at home that are discussed openly and freely, here. These topics mostly consist of extremely personal detail; including politics, religion, love lives, and bodily functions.

It's hard for me to say that simple living is necessary in order to get in tune with your surroundings or understand the world, because I honestly find nothing wrong with enjoying material things or the comforts of home (obviously, not to the extent of "worshipping" them). But, I will say it's necessary for other reasons. Simple living is necessary in order to understand yourself. It requires you to be creative and resourceful. You challenge yourself and learn about what you can and can't work with. I think simple living is necessary because it's one of the best ways to examine what's important in your life and what's excess.
