From the Pastor's Pen

You shall love the Lord your God with all your mind. (Matthew 22:37)

I will confess to you that I have omitted two very important phrases from that quote. When one of the Pharisees asked Jesus which of the commandments in the Law was the greatest, Jesus responded with this: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. It's a direct quote from Deuteronomy 6:5. It's called the Shema and it was central to Israelite liturgy and life.

We hear a lot about the heart and soul today. We like things that appeal to our emotion. We do not hear, though in my opinion, much about the mind. It's almost as if heart and soul automatically exclude the mind. I strongly disagree with that. In fact, we Presbyterians have cultivated a life of the mind for a long time. Some would say that we have done so at the expense of the heart and soul and maybe they have a point. And yet, Jesus told us to love God with all of our heart and soul and our mind. All three are essential to following Jesus.

As you might remember, I started my Doctor of Ministry Degree three years ago this month. I took ten classes over the course of three years and am now on my final project. The classes were challenging, but altogether doable. My final project, however, has been a doozy. It's on ecclesiology, which is a fancy word for a study of the church. It concerns itself with questions like: What is the church? Why does it exist? For whom and by whom does it exist? How does it relate to salvation? My particular study focuses on how all of this

relates to leadership in the local church. If the church is like a not-for-profit organization, for example, then that would shape what leadership should look like. But I believe that it's much more than that, which I think will have a direct impact on how leaders function in it.

I hope to be finished by May of 2018. That's not going to be easy, but I believe it's doable. I shudder to think how much more I have to do. The final project has been, by far, the hardest part of the whole thing so far. I'm only on the introductory chapter. This is going to take a while. In addition to that, I am also part of a study group that is reading all seven hundred pages of John Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion. That's no easy read.

We are all finite, limited people who have been given this incredible access to the infinite, unlimited God. That's an amazing thing. It's also a summons to learn more and more at every opportunity. And just so you know that it's not all tucked up away in some ivory tower with no impact at all on how we live our lives, Jesus gave us another commandment which he said is like the first one. "And the second is like it," he said. "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

So if we want to love our neighbor, we have to first love God with our heart and soul... AND with our minds. So pick up a Bible. Read a book on theology (ask me for recommendations). Join a book discussion group... Either way, love the Lord your God with all your mind. It's one of life's greatest blessings.

THE BEGINNING OF THE CONVERSATION



"Our Father in heaven"

The first word, the pronoun, is significant. Jesus includes himself in the prayer that he is himself teaching us to pray: "Our..."—you and me. We are in this together. Jesus does not assume an aloof stance of an expert, telling us that this is the only way to pray. Prayer is not concerned with getting the words in the right order. When Jesus includes himself with us, the "our" is an unpretentious puncture in the hot-air balloon of affectation. Jesus does not condescend to those who are apprenticed to him. Jesus doesn't talk much about prayer; he prays. Jesus is not patronizing. He prays with us. And we pray with him.

The "our" continues to be significant. Prayer is always "our." With the "our," Jesus puts himself in our company. With the "our," we place ourselves in the company of Jesus and of all who pray. Prayer is never solitary. We are never alone when we pray. We are with Jesus and all others who follow him.

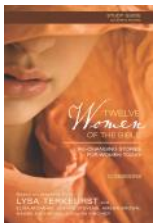

July 23rd– Surviving and Thriving in the Midst of Loss and Grief

The marvelous thing about God is that the deeper the tragedy, the greater the grace. Dawn Smith Jordan is no stranger to both. On May 31, 1985, Dawn's younger sister, Shari, was kidnapped and murdered just two days before her high school graduation. It became the largest

manhunt in South Carolina's history, drawing national attention.

With the hope only found in Jesus Christ, Dawn went on to become Miss South Carolina 1986 and 2nd runner-up to Miss America. The Billy Graham Crusade came to South Carolina that same year, and millions were touched by Dawn's testimony, and her singing of "Amazing Grace."

In 1986 Dawn received a Bachelor of Music degree in Vocal Performance from Columbia College in Columbia, SC. Today, Dawn ministers in up to 75 concerts/events annually. The heartbeat of her music and message is the sufficiency of God's grace, even to the point of forgiving the man who killed her sister.



July 30th - Seasons of Doubt and Crisis of Faith: What does it mean? What should I do?

Rev. Luke H. Maybry was installed as Pastor at Central Steele Creek in March of 2008. Luke grew up in Campobello, South Carolina, and graduated from Wofford College in 1998.
