From the Pastor's Pen

March 16, 2008 is one of the most important dates in my life. It was ten days after my 32nd birthday and the exact sixty-sixth birthday of my aunt, Rosanne, with whom I was very close. She died just over a year after that, so March 16 is special on several fronts. After years of preparation, a lifetime of calling and wrestling, after Greek and Hebrew, and ordination exams, and seminary, after meeting with your Pastoral Nominating Committee. I was ordained and installed at Central Steele Creek on that day. It remains one of the best days of my life. I had no idea, of course, where ordination would lead me and what it would mean day in and day out. I have good days and bad days in ministry like anything else, but that day started me down a path that has led to almost ten wonderful years here. Who knows what the future holds for me, or this church, or The Church... but that day, March 16, 2008 was instrumental in all of it.

As you hopefully know by now, our own Director of Christian Ministries, British Hyrams, will be ordained here on Sunday afternoon, September 17, at 3:00. British will become "Rev. Hyrams" that day, the new Associate Pastor at Central Steele Creek. That's a milestone event for her. I can certainly identify with all that she and her family have sacrificed to arrive at this date. I have been blessed to watch her grow in her ministry. She has tremendous gifts and presence that will serve this church very well. If I do say so myself, we make a great team.

As I have prepared for British' ordination, I have remembered my own in a deeper way. If I could go back and tell that 32-year-old young buck anything on that day, March 16, 2008, what would it be? For one, I would say that ministry is a long game. It's like baseball that way. I had these expectations when I started that I would be wildly successful, without even considering what success in ministry means. well. That means that we strike out 70% of time. But every sermon we preach, class we teach, meeting we lead, or visit we make... they all add up in ways that we cannot calculate at the time. One of the hard things about ministry, unlike other professions, is that it's difficult to quantify and measure success. But maybe it's not about success, but rather faithfulness. I still say that 95% of ministry is faithfully showing up, regardless of any measurable result. Ministry is a long game.

Therefore, it requires a strong grounding in faith. At the end of the day, it's theological. If we don't believe what we say we believe, we may as well turn in our keys and do something else. That may sound obvious, but sometimes it seems like there is no reason at all to do anything that we do unless Jesus is Lord. Then there is every reason. So those spiritual disciplines that remind us of who and whose we are and that keep us grounded in the faith are essential. We ministers should spend as much time and energy on that as we do anything else.

I write this on the occasion of British's ordination to the Ministry of Word & Sacrament, but British isn't the only minister here. If what we proclaim about God is true, then we are ALL ministers. God claims and calls all of us equally. So let us celebrate British' ordination and congratulate her on this tremendous milestone in her life. We are certainly blessed to have her here. And let us all remember that God has "ordered" all of us to do something. God has called us for salvation as well as service. So read your Bible, say your prayers, give generously of your time and resources, go to church, and remember your own baptism and calling. It's what life is all about.

THE BEGINNING OF THE CONVERSATION



"I spent a year there (at my first church) that lasted a lifetime. I tried everything. I worked, planned, offered, but the response was always disappointing. The arguments, the pettiness, the fights in the parking lot after the board meeting were more than I could take. It was tough and I was glad to be leaving them behind. "You call yourself a church!" I muttered to myself as my tires kicked gravel up in the parking lot on my last Sunday among them.

A couple of years later, while visiting at Emory, I met a young man who, after introducing himself, told me that he was now serving that church. My heart went out to him. Such a dear young man, and only twenty-three!

"They still remember you out there," he said.

"Yeah," I said glumly, "I'll never forget them either."

"Remarkable bunch of people," he said.

"That's one way of putting it," I said.

"Their ministry to the community has been a wonder," he continued. "That little church is now supporting, in one way or another, more than a dozen of the troubled families around the church. The free day care center is going great. Not too many interracial congregations in this part of the world. What a great place to be for my first church."

I could hardly believe what he was telling me. What happened? I asked.

"I don't know. One Sunday, things just sort of came together. It wasn't anything in particular. It's just that, when the service was done, and we were on our way out, we knew that Jesus loved us and had plans for us. Things fairly much took off after that."

I'll tell you what I think happened. I think that church got intruded upon. I think someone greater than I knocked the lock off that door, kicked it open and offered them peace, the Holy Spirit, and forgiveness. And now, they are called "church."

Despair over my failures, moral and otherwise, is not permitted a pastor who knows John 20 by heart. Much clergy ethics has its basis here, in our resilient confidence that the same God who raised Jesus from the dead can and will do the same for us as well. Our ethics is not some closed system, not a matter of debating and discerning the rules for right conduct and then following the rules. Our ethics is testimony to the truth that the risen Christ came back to the very followers who had betrayed and forsaken him. Then he forgave them, breathed upon them, and commissioned them to be about his work in the world. His work is the redemption of the world, the recapture of a lost humanity, and the recreation and restoration of Israel. The means of his work, for better or worse, is us. To be enlisted in that mission is a great burden, but on most days, a blessing as well. It is a great blessing to have one's little life caught up in the great doxological crescendo named church, that song sung by the saints throughout the ages, so that we might sing it too today."
