FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Where God Is Leading

At the April meeting of the Session, your church leaders began their meeting discussing "The Leader of the Future", an article written by William C. Taylor which addresses the role of leaders to help identify the reality at Central, affirm the values which define us and embrace the opportunities before us.

By consensus, the following was approved:

- -Minutes of March Session meeting,
- -certificate of transfer of membership for Rob/ Stephanie Vojvoda to Waterlife Church of Lenior, NC, and
- -monthly facilities use.

Motions approved:

-Finance Committee: that an additional \$5000. from New Ministries Fund be allocated to the Arts Center. Funds to be combined with the \$5000. already allocated within 2019 budget to be used to fund the salary for the Arts Center Director for 2019.

-\$10,000. be allocated from the special anonymous gift received August 2019 to provide startup costs for the Arts Center.

Report on Expanding Cultural Diversity: Andy Cheek

"Encounter God, Worship Creatively, and Celebrate God's Love"

Andy Cheek reported that contacts are being made with several architectural designs groups for pricing on a church master plan, schematic renderings on designated areas for improvement and developmental process.

Report on Ministry to Young Families:Charles Wilkerson

"An Arts Center that serves the Steele Creek community and encourages growth through artistic expression within a faith-based environment."

The Arts Center Task Force continues to meet weekly and under the newly hired director (Lori Cauley) is staying the course with beginning a Fall program.

Report on Pastoral Nominating Committee: Chet Knapp

Chet Knapp reported that the search committee continues to receive and read information forms from perspective new pastors.

Discussion focused on developing expanded cultural diversity with intentional action steps with Iglesia Bautista. There was discussion regarding the value of having informal shared conversations on issues of interest to both congregations.

Also was briefly discussed was the reinventing of the Fall Festival and the value of Committee heads gathering for a shared planning season.


the good news!

ence, and grief can seem overwhelming. By learning more about where our modern funeral practices originated, we can find comfort in knowing we are not alone in the experience, and we too can handle it.

Rev. Earl presented histories of funeral practices from several ancient cultures, which were referenced in scripture. Amazingly, many of them are what we practice in some form today. From the preparation of the deceased, service with hymns, procession to burial, and even the meal for the family, so much of how we grieve today has been handed-down from those before us. Rituals are a big part of how we humans process death, and it was interesting to see where some of our familiar ones originated.

He also provided some practical advice based on his experiences with modern-day funerals, including the varying costs of funeral services and some personal stories about spreading of ashes. We were all encouraged to think and talk about our desires with our family members. This makes the process easier for them, and lets them know what our personal wishes are. It's a gift you can leave for your loved ones, and will greatly ease the burden all around.

When you think about it, Easter itself is THE greatest conversation about death and funerals. It reminds us that though we too will face the darkness of the tomb, death will not keep us in it. That's because the Son already rose for us, and with Easter, we celebrate again in His light. Martha Osborne


