FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Where God is Leading

Your church leadership gathered Thursday, June 27 for their June Session meeting. By general consent the Session approved:

- -Session minutes of May 23/June 23
- -Statistics on membership from the Clerk

Primary time of the meeting was devoted to discussing and acting upon the report from the Facility Use Task Force. This Appointed Task Force consisted of British Hyrams, Sallie English, Della Medlin, Susan Osmar and Jeanne Sikes-McGrath. They were commissioned with the work to review the current Facilities Use Policy Manual and make recommendations back to the Session. After discussion and review, the Session voted in favor to adopt the majority of recommendations which will be communicated in detail to the larger congregation in the immediate future.

Also appointed was the 2019 Nominating Committee consisting of Clint Burke, Reuben Mozingo, Judy Brown and Pam Brooks.

Information was shared by:

- Charles Wilkerson and the continued forward movement of the Central Fine Arts Academy. Mr. Wilkerson reported on the development of the program and the ways in which church members will be able to assist with the new ministry.
- Andy Cheek addressed the continued discussions regarding expanding cultural diversity. Leadership met with the church hired architect (ADA) last Wednesday. Next steps will seek to involve the larger congregation seeking input and ultimately, a design presentation.

- Chet Knapp reported on the work of the Pastoral Nominating Committee. To date there have been six on-line interviews scheduled and three second interviews for the month of July.
- Publicity/Communications Committee reported on the all-day training for "REALM" which is the new staff/ member web based program.
- Finance Committee requested that Committees begin to prepare their 2020 budget requests and submit them no later than August.
- Christian Education Committee asks that all highlight July 27 and a church "Fiesta" which will invite Chambers Point, the Central pre-school, and members of Iglesia Bautista Emanuel.

Gratitude was expressed to: Jeanne Sikes-McGrath, Charlie Bricker, Becky Helms and Allyson Haenlein for participation in web training; to Judy and Mike Brown for their mission work with the homeless; to those who participated in the most recent Work Day (including the members of Iglesia Bautista Emanuel) and to those who served on the Facilities Use Task Force

The meeting concluded with prayer and the celebration of Holy Communion.



PRAYING WITH FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE FOR CMPD, OTHER PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICIALS, AND OUR GREAT COMMUNITY On Tuesday, May 7, 2019, due to increasing rates of violence and homicide, the CMPD reached out to members of the faith community and asked that you pray for the CMPD, other first responders, and our beloved city. Thank you for taking the time to pray. You were one of over thirty congregations who committed to pray. Though diverse in faith tradition, you were united for a common cause. Participants included AME Zion, Baha'i, Baptist, Christian (non-denominational), Greek Orthodox, Hindu, Methodist, Metropolitan Community, Moravian, Muslim, Presbyteri-

an, and United Church of Christ congregations.

Congregations prayed beyond our expectation, not just for 30 days but for 34 days. We hope you will continue to pray for our community and for the end of violence. We also hope you will consider other acts of faith, such as joining our Chaplaincy Program and/or meeting together to discuss ways in which we might serve together in bringing peace to our city.

We plan to invite a representative from each congregation to join us for lunch in July (details to follow). This will be an opportunity for us to thank you as well as a time for us to break bread together, engage in conversation, and build relationships among us. We also ask that you consider joining our Chaplaincy Program. Information about that opportunity is attached.
