FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Members of Central,

We continue with our summer series on "What Presbyterians Believe" and I have appreciated your participation during the Sunday School hour. The open sharing on the authority of Scripture and salvation has helped me to grow and further understand the faith community which is Central. Next Sunday will provide the opportunity for feedback on remarks shared regarding "salvation" and then in two weeks Kathy Bricker will continue with the series of "What Presbyterians Believe" addressing the issue of heaven and hell.

One of my favorite Peanuts cartoons has Snoopy hard at work at his typewriter. He explains to Charlie Brown that he is writing a book on theology. The title? "Has it Ever Occurred to You that You Might Be Wrong?" I think Snoopy is on to something – a profound theological question. I think Snoopy must have been reading the great American theologian Reinhold Niebuhur. Niebuhur once wrote that democratic social and political harmony are possible only when individuals and groups with widely differing beliefs and values are willing to entertain the possibility that they just might be wrong, that none of us has cornered the market on the whole truth, that the other side just might have a measure of truth too. Without some degree of open-mindedness, of humility and respect, we quickly descend into stark fanaticisms. We see this unfolding at different places within culture.

I think this is one of the benefits of the series "What Presbyterians Believe" and I have welcomed comments shared. As one author has stated, "being open-minded does not mean being emptied-headed." I believe, as

Peter Marshall once stated, that those who don't stand for something are likely to fall for anything. It is equally simplistic and false to believe that all expressions of our faith are the same, that all teach the same truth and lead to the same end. There are items of my faith which are beyond compromise which I hold to "Truth". I also believe that a church is most healthy not when it tells people what to believe, but provides a safe and open community where questions can be asked and one's faith can be discovered. All of us hold to some standards of faith which are True. Every pathway to Christ takes it own course and every Christian journeys and sometimes we find individuals who do not profess to be Christians who live more closely to the way of Christ than many who profess to be His followers.

The following of Christ gives to all of us our greatest joy and yet demands from all of us our deepest discipleship and commitment. My hope is that you would join us Sunday morning and welcome the opportunity to grow in faith.

A Fine Arts Academy that serves the community and encourages growth through artistic expression within a faith-based environment.

Central Fine Arts Academy is an outreach to the Steele Creek community and surrounding area. It will provide quality music, art and dance instruction for elementary age students. The academy will open this September and provide chorus and group instruction to allow students in Grades 3,4 & 5 to explore their creative interests in a safe and supportive environment.

For our congregation, the CFAA can offer the joy and excitement of young people growing in creativity. We will encourage students to demonstrate their learning within the life of our church. We will have the opportunity to build relationships with young families and to welcome them to participate in our worship and our faith community.

Our Approach:

Six week sessions will allow students to be introduced to musical instruments, an art focus or technique, and/or a dance style. Through this introduction in a small group setting, students can determine if the musical instrument or dance/art technique is one that they want to pursue further. As students grow in their ability and interest, there will be additional classes at higher levels. The classes will be taught by qualified instructors in their field.

The July meeting of Session was opened with reading of Scripture and discussion on the many ways in which prayer can be used in the context of Committee meetings.

The Clerk recognized the need for determination of a quorum at both Session and Congregational meetings. With changes to the Book of Order the determination is currently left up to each Session/ congregation. The recommendation did not justify a called meeting of the Congregation merely for this issue so motion was approved to present changes at the next congregational meeting which will be later this fall when receiving the report of the Church Nominating Committee.

At the June Session meeting there was approved a revised Facilities Rental policy. (highlights of the policy can be found on following column) Amendments to the approved policy were presented at the July meeting. They were:

- Changing recommendation from payment by money order, cashier, or certified check to payment by personal/corporate check and or money order.
- That Iglesia Bautista Emanuel be except from established rental fees as set forth in policy and from restrictions of use regarding the FLC kitchen.

Time was devoted to an introduction and education on REALM. REALM is the newest online church management software which has been purchased by Central. REALM will ultimately become Central's primary communication tool for all members as we move into the future. It will include an accurate church directory, a location for church committees to report and share, a location for financial reporting, and much more. This was a first introduction to church leadership knowing well that the incorporation into the larger congregation will take time and the use of REALM by the larger congregation will be done at a pace so all will benefit.

The following Committees reported on their work:

- Central Fine Arts Academy is now receiving their first student registrations for a Fall beginning. Members are encouraged to fill out pew cards in offering their support of this new ministry.
- Committee on expanding Cultural Diversity continues in conversation with ADA (architectural firm) and the firm will share findings to the Committee on Tuesday evening, July 30.
- Chet Knapp reported on the continued work of the Pastoral Nominating Committee.
- Clint Burke reported that the Church Nominating Committee will hold their first meeting on Sunday, July 28, immediately following worship.

The Session expressed gratitude to:

Joe McGrath and his labor in the children's playground removing unsafe equipment, to Charles Wilkerson for his expertise in marketing our Fine Arts Academy, to Becky Helms and the Publicity/ Communications Committee in devoting time and energy to integrating a new phone system and WIFI on the church grounds.

The meeting concluded with prayer and celebration of the Lord's Supper.
