Active Survival Training Recap

On Saturday October 19, 2019 more than 50 people, representing over 500 others who are on the campus of Central Creek Presbyterian Church each week, were part of the Active Survival Training Program put on by the Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Department. The presenter was Officer Jonathan Frisk, a 17 year veteran of CMPD.

Officer Frisk set the tone for the session by presenting details and slides of some of the most well known mass shootings of the last 20 years.

One of the most interesting statistics was that the average shooter event lasted 12 minutes with 69% ending in less than 5 minutes. The average CMPD response time was 6.2 minutes. This means that individual citizens had to make life or death decisions even when law enforcement was present or able to respond within minutes.

Officer Frisk demonstrated the ABC Survival Plan with the help of several members of the audience. The three parts of the plan are Avoid, Barricade and Counter. To get a full description of the plan go to the website "Surviving an Active Shooter-Charlotte Chamber".

Central Fine Arts Academy is fulfilling its purpose of inspiring children in the creative arts. At the conclusion of the first 6-week session, our students gave this feedback.

- All the students said that they liked coming to class and learned a lot from their teachers.
- What did the students like the most? Responses included:
 - Learning new things that I did not know but now I do.
 - Singing the high notes. (Others: dancing, singing, learning Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star on the violin)
 - Making new friends and using my hands.

There were satisfied parents who saw their children enjoy and learn from the classes. A number said that their child learned more than they expected in the first session.

Many church members helped make this possible. Joy Cheek, Pam Wilkerson, Ann Mozingo, George and Ellie Bostick, Wray Moxley and Chris Knapp volunteered to attend each Tuesday evening from 6 pm - 7 pm to encourage the students and talk with the parents, as well as being the second adult in each class. One parent noted that "People are so friendly here".

The CFAA Planning Team continues to take an active role.

The CFAA classes are organized into 6-week sessions. The 6week format allows students to be introduced to musical instruments, an art focus or technique, and/or a dance style. Through this introduction in a small group setting, students can determine if the musical instrument or dance/art technique is one that they want to pursue further. Higher levels and additional instruments will be added as students grow in their interests. Five 6-week sessions are offered throughout the school year. Private lessons will be offered in the future. The Session met for their October meeting on October 24. The meeting opened with prayer and with a review of previous meeting minutes and facilities requests.

As an opening devotion, Dr. Earl focused on John 10:18 and the use of power as both a creative and destructive force within the church. His words were those of consolation and commendation to Central's leadership and faithfulness.

Clerk Chet Knapp provided a brief overview of his attending the "Meet and Greet" at the Presbytery Cluster meeting. In a response following worship of this past Sunday, the Session officially received into the church membership Mary Jane Palmer, Roger Palmer, Beth Boykin, Page Courts and Ben Huffaker.

A brief period of sharing was held in paving the way for Rev. Lee. At the request of Rev. Lee, communion will be celebrated the second Sunday in November rather than the first. December will return to the sacrament being celebrated the first Sunday of the month. Adjustments were made to scheduled meetings of Session for November and December taking into consideration the holidays.

Motions Approved:

Extension of the "Y" contract for the 2020 year. Discussion followed regarding a review of our partnership with the "Y" and addressing implications of anything more than an annual contract.

Included in the 2020 contract was a monthly increase of fees by \$100.00. Attention is being given to strengthening the relationship between the "Y" and Central by holding weekly informational meetings.

Shared Information:

Fine Arts Academy announced "showcase" which will be held this Tuesday evening, 6:00 PM, in the choir room. All are invited to come and discover what the children have learned now at the conclusion of this six-week first session.

Cultural Diversity Committee will be meeting Monday, Oct. 28 to review information gleaned from meeting with the church architect.

Finance Committee will be receiving pledge cards from members with the 2020 budget to be approved at the November meeting of Session.

Worship and Fellowship Committees remind the larger membership of the Installation Service for Rev. Lee, Sunday, Nov. 17 (3:00 PM) with a reception to follow.

Stewardship Committee received pledge cards from Elders and will distribute the pledge packets this Sunday, October 27, in worship.

Publicity Committee gave an update on REALM and expressed gratitude for nearly 60 members logging on. More to come.

Mission Committee will be having a representative of Urban Ministry at their Nov. 10 meeting (11:45) to address the issue of poverty and those homeless within the Steele Creek area. Members are invited to attend the meeting.

Christian Education Committee shared that they are almost finished with commitments to those who participated in the most recent child/youth protection policy training. The Women's Retreat date has been set for August 28-31, 2020.

Presbytery meeting will be held this coming Tuesday, October 29 at Hopewell Presbyterian in Huntersville. Pat Hart is planning on driving the church bus enabling a good representation from Central to support the call to Rev. Lee. Departure from the church will be at 10:30am. If you desire to travel with others please contact the church office or Sandy Hart.

Prayer concerns were directed to Della Medlin, Marge Caselli, JoAnna Harrigan, Burns Taylor, Beth Boykin, Greta Lambert, Brad Tobias, and Herman Canipe. Joy was shared with Brad Tobias returning home from the hospital and Matt Wilkerson and his two years of continued healing.

Gratitude was Expressed to Charles Wilkerson and Steele Creek Printing for their work with stewardship, to Pat Hart and leadership with the Survival Training Workshop, to supporting church members of the Central Fine Arts Program and to John Earl for his leadership during the past eighteen months.

The meeting closed with prayer and the celebration of Holy Communion.



On October 15th you will receive an invitation to join Realm, Central's new communication tool. In preparation, we suggest you keep this page handy to assist you when logging into Realm the first time.

SETTING UP YOUR PASSWORD

On October 15, after you open your email, click on the link and follow the prompts to set up your Realm password. <u>You will need to be on a computer or tablet the first time you log into Realm</u>. After you set up your password you will be able to download the Realm Connect app and log into your mobile device.

(You will need to use one of the following browsers: Chrome, Firefox, and Microsoft Edge for Windows and Safari for Mac computers. Realm will not work on Internet Explorer.)

REVIEW YOUR PROFILE

After you set up your password and log into Realm, you will need to update your profile information. To do this:

- Click on your NAME in the blue area located in the upper right hand corner of your screen. Select MY PROFILE from the drop down menu.
- Click on EDIT PROFILE and update your contact information. Make changes as needed and be sure to click on SAVE at the bottom of your screen.
- While in the EDIT mode, click on PERSONAL INFORMATION and update as needed and SAVE.
- 4. Next select MANAGE PRIVACY and select who you want to see your contact information and personal information. IMPORTANT: To be included in the online directory, you need to select EVERYONE. Be sure to SAVE any changes. (Being in the online directory means that other Realm users at your church can see your profile listed when they click Directory in the main menu. Think of it like being in the printed directory booklet that we used to publish.)

To log in in the future, enter the web address <u>https://onrealm.org</u>. We suggest you save the Realm link to your favorites.
