From the Pastor's Pen

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea.

Psalm 46:1-2

My, what a difference a week makes. Last week at this time, I was getting geared up for a busy but fairly normal week at work. Lots of things were happening, but nothing out of the ordinary for this time of year: session meetings, stewardship packets, DMin papers, and sermons. I was excited to hear Governor Pat McCrory speak to my Rotary Club. House Bill 2 was the big elephant in the room. Tuesday came and he spoke.

I don't even remember what he said now. Never would I have imagined seeing him and all of Charlotte's leaders on CNN that very night. Some two measly hours after hearing him, CMPD Officer Brentley Vincent would confront, shoot, and kill Keith Lamont Scott, thus starting a round of violent protests the likes of which I have never seen here. After six nights of protest, eighty-two arrests (approximately), another fatality in the protests (this time by a civilian), three disturbing video tapes, and National Guard soldiers on the street corners... After all of that, this city is fundamentally different than it was a week ago. Charlotte might be lots of things, but a progressive, prosperous, "New South" city that has shed its troubling racial past we are not.

Charlotte is still a great place to live and raise a family and I am proud to call it home. But we as a predominantly white church have a great deal of reaching out to do. I always suspected this, but like every American generation before us, race will be a defining issue of our day. I hope and pray that we at Central Steele Creek Presbyterian Church can come out on the right, biblical, and faithful side of it.

All of this, of course, comes at a time of great change and opportunity for our church. As you have already heard and will continue to hear, one of our sister churches, Steele Creek Presbyterian, will have to move locations within the next three or so years. As such, the possibility has arisen that four other Presbyterian churches in the area, two of which are predominantly black (Mt. white (Central Steele Creek & Pleasant Hill) could all merge into one large, interracial congregation.

Whatever we end up deciding, whether it's to sell our property and merge or stay put, will have major implications for our future. We are having a church-wide lunch on Sunday afternoon, October 16th, after worship to discuss this decision. The purpose of the lunch is three-fold. First, we want to update you on recent developments. We have a bit more to tell you than we did when we met last spring. The second purpose of the meeting is to hear some arguments for and against merging. We can make good, theological, faithful arguments either way, and I want to present all sides of those arguments to you. Finally, we want to give you an opportunity to express your questions and opinions. As such, we will break up into smaller groups and give you an opportunity to speak and to be heard.

We are NOT making any decisions on Sunday, October 16. But the session is going to discern, based off October 16, what other steps we need to make in order to make that decision. We cannot be in limbo on this forever. We must make a decision for everybody's sake sooner rather than later. Know also that whatever decision we make should be made on the basis of prayer and discernment about how we can be faithful to what God has called us to do in this time and place. That may well be merging, but it may well be staying put.

All of which brings be back to the events of this week. In some ways, they are unrelated to this monumental decision. But in many other ways, they clearly ARE related. Our community is hurting, much more so than we thought. People feel disaffected, disenfranchised, overlooked, and forgotten. People don't protest for nothing. Charlotte's prosperity has been good for most of us and we have been good for it. But it has left a whole chunk of people out. I believe that the church has a fundamental role to play in healing the divides in this city. Government can only go so far. It can change laws, but it's hearts that need changing the most. And that is our game. That is God's game and God has called our

number. Whether we stay or whether we go... I pray that we can respond faithfully. It's the defining call of our times. —Luke

THE BEGINNING OF THE CONVERSATION



"Consider the following contrasts: inward looking selfpreservation versus expansive, outgoing evangelism; return to the old days versus a new, hitherto unimaginable future; grief versus joy; doubt versus praise; fearfulness and hiding versus courage that goes public, defying the judicial injunction to remain silent (Acts 4:18-20); disbelief versus conviction; confusion versus clarity. In sum, "God help us" versus "Hallelujah, Jesus lives." To put this in pastoral terms, the contrast is between ministry focused on ourselves-missional timidity and ecclesiastical maintenance that protects and preserves what we have, with a vague though uncertain hope for continued life-or ministry that bursts forth in creative, overflowing desire to tell the world, "Jesus is risen!" Imagine the astonished newspaper headline: "Church Affirms Jesus Is Alive, and Lives Believing It's True." It is the difference between ministry without power, because everything is left up to us to do, leaving us anxious and exhausted, and ministry filled with joy and hope because the Lord not only lives but also reigns and acts in power for us.
