Central Fine Arts Academy

How can you help ignite the love of music and art and the creative spark in children? How can you help cultivate relationships with young families that show the care and connection that a church community can provide?

Central Fine Arts Academy is an outreach ministry to our Steele Creek community. It will provide quality music, art and dance instruction for elementary age students in Grades 3,4,& 5. The classes start on September 17^{th} and will be held on Tuesday evening from 6:00 - 7:00 pm.

The classes will be scheduled for five 6-week sessions throughout the school year. Initially these will be chorus and small group classes which include:

Chorus - as the Steele Creek Children's Choir

Violin (beginning) –*introduces students to string* Instruments

Guitar - learn the fundamentals and experience the fun of playing music with others

Chimes - introduces reading music, rhythm and partici - pating in a music group

Sculpture – increasing a child's awareness of 3-D through work with clay

Dance – *emphasizes expressive movement.*

The variety of classes will change as the academy grows. In the future, private lessons will be added to the program. The tuition and fees include:

Registration fee for a new student: \$30 Each Class: \$120 per 6 week session Discounts of \$20 per session are available for:

 Students with a parent who is a member of Central Steele Creek Presbyterian Church.

• Students when more than one family member is taking a class. Scholarships are available based on need. Scholarships are provided by the Sheila Fetner Memorial Fund and other donations.

As part of this ministry, it will be critical that we build relationships with young families and to welcome them to participate in our faith community. Every member of our congregation can help, as shown below.

- Be a class volunteer. Each class will require a second adult as part of our child safety policy.
- Be a host in the parent hospitality room.
- Attend the performances (recitals or exhibits) that are planned for the end of each session:
- Help prepare a reception for students and their families after the performances.
- Financial gifts. Scholarships will be provided to students with financial need.
- Help promote Central Fine Arts Academy with friends, family and neighbors.
