From the Pastor's Pen

Happy New Year! As we begin this new year, I would like to encourage all of you, as well as myself, to organize and commit to your prayer life. Prayer is one of the ways we can communicate with God and grow a stronger relationship with Him. But I can tell you from first person experience that some days, prayer can be hard... very hard... and on other days pravers flow out much more easily and freely. The word "prayer" derives from the Latin word, precarious, and it captures the heart of why we sometimes pray, which is out of precarious events and circumstances in our lives. We also pray because we are in awe of God's omnipotent power and because we are grateful for God's unending grace & mercy. Prayer is important because it helps us to stay close to God and helps us to grow in our relationship with God. When we pray, we are opening our hearts to Him and He is able to work in us and through us.

C. S. Lewis said, "I pray because I can't help myself. I pray because the need flows out of me all the time, waking and sleeping. It doesn't change God. It changes me." Prayer is important because it makes us more like Jesus and because it reveals to us the heart and mind of God. There are many passages in the Bible that emphasize the importance of prayer... Ephesians 6:18 says "Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints." Romans 12:12 says, "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." Philippians 4:6 says, "Do not be anxious

about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

Prayer was important to Jesus because it was his connection to the Heavenly Father. It equipped him for the struggles and temptations he was about to face and enabled him to sustain his intimate relationship with God. Jesus also received guidance, desires, and strength from God in his time of prayer. From our Director of Music Ministries:

Greetings and Happy New Year from the Music Ministry!

2022 was a wonderful year of growth and change for our music ministry and congregation as a whole. Throughout the 2022 calendar year:

- The Handbell ensemble grew in size by more than doubling its personnel.
- The choir maintained a regular rehearsal and Sunday worship schedule after the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, we, as a ministry, increased our rehearsal time from 45 minute weekly rehearsals to 2 hour weekly rehearsals.
- A beautiful Yamaha piano was installed in the sanctuary, creating a more worshipful and musical atmosphere.
- We shared in joint worship with our sister church, IBE, in April.
- We were led closer to God through the words and music of Dawn Smith Jordan in July 2022.
- The members of Central léarned over 40 new contemporary worship songs that we can now sing as a congregation.

Over the course of the next year, we will continue to strive for musical excellence in our worship by finding new and innovative ways to engage our congregation. CSCPC Helps Children Who Deal with Housing Insecurity

Too many children have no stable housing and so are frequently moving: sometimes staying in shared spaces with friends or relatives, sometimes in shelters or poor quality hotels. In North Carolina, 1.9% of all children with unstable housing—perhaps higher in Charlotte. Steele Creek area schools see the impact on the children everyday: academically but also lacking of warm clothing and sufficient food. School social workers and counselors are the connection to these families.

This is how Central is helping these children:

- Week-end food bags for students at Steele Creek Elementary
 (12) and South Pine Academy (15) each week. Your donations
 to the Dare to Care Fund and help in assembling the bags are
 much needed and appreciated.
- Gift cards (\$50) to allow the families of the Steele Creek children to buy the clothing and items most needed. The Mighty Acts class provided these cards from monies raised in the annual golf tournament.
- Clothing items and a Christmas gift for 2 students attending Southwest Middle School and living in hotels. Mighty Acts members selected the items and wrapped them for Christmas.
